Subject: Property Tax Rate Ordinance: Attorney Brammell held the second reading of an ordinance setting the real and personal property tax rates at 31.2 per \$100.00 assessment and motor vehicle and water craft rate at 26.6 per \$100.00 assessment for 2020. Motion made by Member Meadows and seconded by Member Mason to adopt the ordinance as read. On a call for votes, all members present voted "Yea".

Subject – Discussion of Sunday Sales: Mayor Stephens reported he wanted to make sure the Sunday sales passed on the county side before we (the city) made any changes. Member Armstrong stated that if the whole county is selling alcohol on Sunday and Eminence is not, it just causes confusion, plus she wanted to keep the revenue inside the city. There was a consensus of the council to have Sunday sales.

Subject: First Reading of Ordinance Authorizing Sunday Sales of Alcoholic Beverages: Attorney Brammell held the first reading of the ordinance authorizing Sunday Sales of Alcoholic Beverages.

Subject: Cost Recovery: Member Meadows discussed with the council the opportunity to recover money from insurance for calls the fire department is dispatched to. James Riddle from High Tech Rescue came and gave a presentation to the fire board. Member Meadows would like to earmark any money received to help pay down fire truck loan or purchase equipment. Attorney Brammell was asked to look at preparing a resolution and look over the contract. The council would like to adopt the resolution at the October, 2020 meeting.

With no further business to be discussed, motion made by Member Armstrong and seconded by Member Mason to adjourn. All Members present voted "Yea". Meeting adjourned at 6:37 p.m.
